		heard back at GamingGrantL:\$9200 deposited Oct5,. Jay needs to comb through bank transfers. Approved budget for this year will be sent out. There may still be 1 or 2 receipts for the halloween dance. Meredith indicated the Halloween budget showed 1820 as opposed to \$1500. She asked for specifics. Jay indicated the actual expense was \$3750 but we made more than what we budgeted for. We made \$1295 profit. Dwayne thanked Jay for all of his work.	
4	Administration updates	Dwayne Doyle provided an administration update. Karen did not have an update. Was thankful to CV for the welcome. Dwayne land and water stewardship. On Left side of the field there is no watering system. 3 drought resistant trees planted. They are being watered by students. Watering truck in the summer. Stream of Dreams participation. We added 4 rain gardens in the parking lot and a 5th big one at the front of CV. Fresh and clean water added to Bowker Creek which will hopefully result in more fish. Learning garden. Fence is in. Planting intention in pre-spring. A class has taken ownership of front garden (e.g pumpkins, garlic). Hoping to work with UVic at Mt. Tolmie	None

Amphitheater plan. Originally there was an intention to create an amphitheater in the tiered section near the basketball court. Dwayne may speak further with facilities.

Start up went well. Changes occurred in the office. Put kids in an intended permanent classroom and then 3 days to figure it out. Only 6 kids moved this year with this new approach.

Staffing continues to be a challenge in particular with EAs. We are funded for 9. CV initially paid for the 10 and 11th then the district came back and paid for the 10th. CV continues to pay for the 11th. Last year CV had full staff for only one day.

Just finishing start-up now. Things are moving like usual now.

Kerri has been advocating for the tiered space. Also advocating for a wheelchair accessible exit at that location. Dwayne said it would require a lift. Kerri mentioned extra funding for mobility access. Could this be considered when we plan for this place.

There isn't wheelchair access in the annex. The lift cannot be used independently. An update would require \$15,000 modification at minimum.

Kerri asked about plants that were moved due to Annex. Dwayne said there is a plan for more trees to be



planted but two more child care units may be added in the back field. The decision to plant more trees would be made after this is determined. child care units will be a consultation process. Kerri asked school community be involved as early in the process as possible. Approximate timeline is 1.5 - 6 years. Our infrastructure needs to be able to handle this expansion.

The administration update was provided in a dialogue conversation with the following topics discussed:

- CV Greening rain gardens are now done, and we have committed to the installation of the learning garden fence and water bib.
- April 26-27 Student led Russell Book Fair (Library).
- Lunch program and affordability fund (some carry over but not for food).
- Invoice for Grade 5 hoodies affordability fund.
- Prep time changes:
 - Addition of 10 minutes of prep time will result in our Music Prep.
 - This will mean all teachers will receive more prep time, so the staff took time to consider options and chose to support the additional prep time with music prep.
- Staffing updates:
 - We are in the middle of our staffing process but wanted you to know that Amy Polson will be leaving CV next year



and Amei Mai will be joining us. • This is public knowledge but not widely known and Amy has not yet shared this with her class, so please keep this quiet for now. 5 VCPAC updates Meredith. Will reimburse BCCPAC fees at treasurer@vcpac.ca. Concern about outdated textbooks. Teachers turning to online resources. Drop in welcome centre at the school board. A lot of information about gang recruitment in Victoria. Police to provide info session at Mt Doug school. Nov 22 at 7:00 pm. Meredith with send out registration confirmation.
